### Description

This MAb recognizes a protein of ~50kDa which is identified as Glial Fibrillary Acidic Protein (GFAP). It shows no cross-reaction with other intermediate filament proteins. GFAP is specifically found in astroglia. GFAP is a very popular marker for localizing benign astrocyte and neoplastic cells of glial origin in the central nervous system. Antibody to GFAP is useful in differentiating primary gliomas from metastatic lesions in the brain and for documenting astrocytic differentiation in tumors outside the CNS.

### Application Note

Flow Cytometry (1-2µg/million cells); Immunofluorescence (2-3µg/ml); Immunohistochemistry (Formalin-fixed) (1-2µg/ml for 30 minutes at RT)(Staining of formalin-fixed tissues requires heating tissue sections in 10mM Tris with 1mM EDTA, pH 9.0, for 45 min at 95°C followed by cooling at RT for 20 minutes);

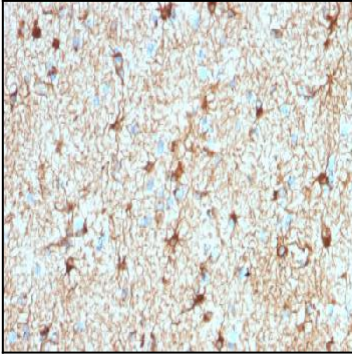


Figure 1: Formalin-fixed, paraffin-embedded human Cerebellum stained with GFAP Rabbit Recombinant Monoclonal Antibody (ASTRO/1974R).

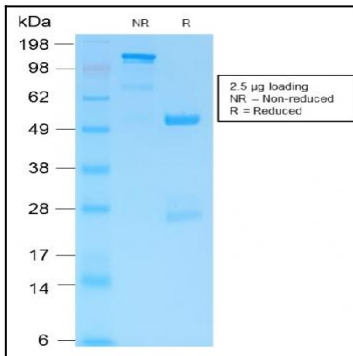


Figure 2: SDS-PAGE Analysis of Purified GFAP Rabbit Recombinant Monoclonal Antibody (ASTRO/1974R).
